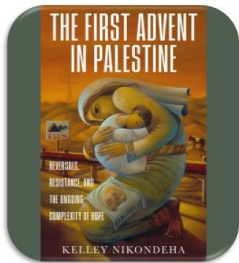
ANGEL TREE PROJECT

FEEDING OUR NEIGHBORS

In light of SNAP benefits being unavailable right now, the Missions/Social Concerns Committee has discussed how FUMC can respond. There are two ways you can give to folks in need:

- Truscott Elementary is starting a food pantry for their families and has asked FUMC to help stock it. Their families in need are looking for these items: rice (1 or 2 lb bags), canned soup, canned pinto beans, pasta and cereal. These shelf-stable items will go a long way. You can bring these items to the church on Sundays or during office hours (M-Th 8-3, Fri 8-12) between now and Thanksgiving. Look for the Truscott collection box in Lobby Court.
- You can make a financial donation that will be given to the Food Bank of Larimer County. Bring or mail a check made out to First United Methodist Church with Food Bank or FBLC in the memo line.
