Lior Navok is an Israeli contemporary composer, conductor, and pianist born in Tel Aviv in 1971. He has a doctorate in music from the New England Conservatory of Music in Boston. In the United States his music has been featured at the Tanglewood Music Festival and performed at Carnegie Hall as well as in other countries. Dr. Navok's compositions are characterized by their emotional depth and innovative use of instrument timbres. 
TRUSCOTT POZOLE DINNER

OPPORTUNITIES FOR LENTEN DISCOVERY

Lent is a time to examine ourselves. It's a time to consider our life journey, the paths we're choosing, the pilgrimage that defines our lives. This year our Lenten experience will be centered on examining our hearts, our faith and our place in the world through pilgrimage. **You are invited to engage in pilgrimage through a variety of meaningful ways during Lent.**

- In the Middle Ages, violence on the roads made it too risky for most people to make a physical, long distance pilgrimage and thus the practice of walking a labyrinth became a "stand in" for the pilgrimage to the holy lands. **Start your Lenten pilgrimage practices a bit early by learning some new spiritual practices.** Learn how to use a **labyrinth** and the methods of **centering prayer, lectio divina** (contemplative scripture reading) and **visio divina** (contemplation using art). Held **January 27th**, there are **two time options** for you to choose from: **2:00-4:00pm** in Heart Hub and **6:00-8:00pm** in Soul Shelter (formerly youth range) and Heart Hub. Contact Rev. - The **Ash Wednesday service** will be held here **at FUMC** at **6:30pm** on **February 18th**. Come enter into the Lenten season at this reflective ecumenical service, which will include an imposition of ashes.



- Mark your calendars for a **movie night!** (Well, really a movie afternoon.) On **Sunday, February 22nd, at 2:45pm** we'll gather in Heart Hub to enjoy the moving, funny and inspirational movie, "The Way" (2010), starring Martin Sheen. The movie will kick off our Lenten experience, helping us remember how precious life is and how important it is to take time to think about our life journey. Popcorn and sodas will be provided. Feel free to bring a comfy chair or cushion or your own snacks.

Parents, childcare will be provided!

As this movie launches our Lenten time of reflection, you are encouraged to watch this movie on your own if you aren't able to attend in person at the church.

- Join Revs. Leslie, Lee and Bryson on a spiritual journey. Our **Lenten book study** will explore the **bestselling book by Fr. Richard Rohr, Falling Upward**. Fr. Rohr seeks to help readers come to terms with the two halves of life, teaching that we can't understand the meaning of "up" until we have fallen "down." More importantly, Rohr describes what "up" can look like in the second half of life. Most of us tend to think of the second half of life in chronological terms, but this book proposes a different paradigm...spiritual maturity. Learn how we "grow

spiritually much more by doing it wrong than by doing it right". Find practical guidance to live a life of love and meaning in a world of suffering and challenge. Falling Upward is an invitation to living the gospel and a call to ongoing transformation.

Classes will be held at **11:30am** following worship **each Sunday, March 8th – 29th in Fellowship Hall.** Books are a bit pricier for this bestselling title at \$22 each. A sign-up sheet will be available this Sunday, January 25th at the Ask Me Desk. Don't let the price of the book scare you away. - **Custom Lenten devotionals** will arrive in your inbox each **Monday, Wednesday and Friday**, during Lent. We hope you enjoy brief moments of reflection. They will also be posted on Facebook. You're encouraged to like and share with your friends.
- Join us in worship for a six week **Lenten sermon series called "The Way"**. You don't have to travel far – or even leave your home – to discover more intentional times of contemplation and connection with God.



- In the comfort of your own space, engage in **virtual “Street Wisdom Walkshops”** during Lent. Making intentional journeys has been a ritual of humankind across time and traditions. **Dr. Marcia McFee will be hosting online “walkshops” each week of the Lent season.** Using Zoom, Dr. Marcia will guide us through a time of “wandering” in order to gain wisdom for our lives. Based on the philosophy and practice of an international organization called “Street Wisdom” created by David Pearl, these sessions can be done on your phone as you take a walk around your city or neighborhood, or on a computer as you “travel” the rooms of your home—whatever works! CIRCLE OF LIFE GROUP

“I was bad so my parents got divorced...” “If I had been with her, the car wouldn’t have hit her...” These are some stories from Circle of Life. Circle of Life is a program that trains volunteers who provide support and resilience education for grieving children in the Thompson School District. Bev Goodier, M.A., from FUMC, and other community professionals provide training for volunteers from FUMC and Trinity Lutheran Church. School counselors identify students who have had a death, divorce or incarceration and provide a space for our groups to meet.

Mary Camp from TLC is our administrator who works with the schools to schedule the groups. Early intervention after a loss can help prevent a host of issues that can develop in people who receive no help after a loss. This is what motivates us to provide support for kids experiencing distressing events in their lives.

Please pray for these volunteers as they begin the new year with new groups, new kids and new stories.

SALVATION ARMY BELL RINGING TOTALS

FUMC members raised \$3,145.17 for the Loveland Salvation Army through their bell ringing at Sam’s Club over 6 Saturdays in November and December.
